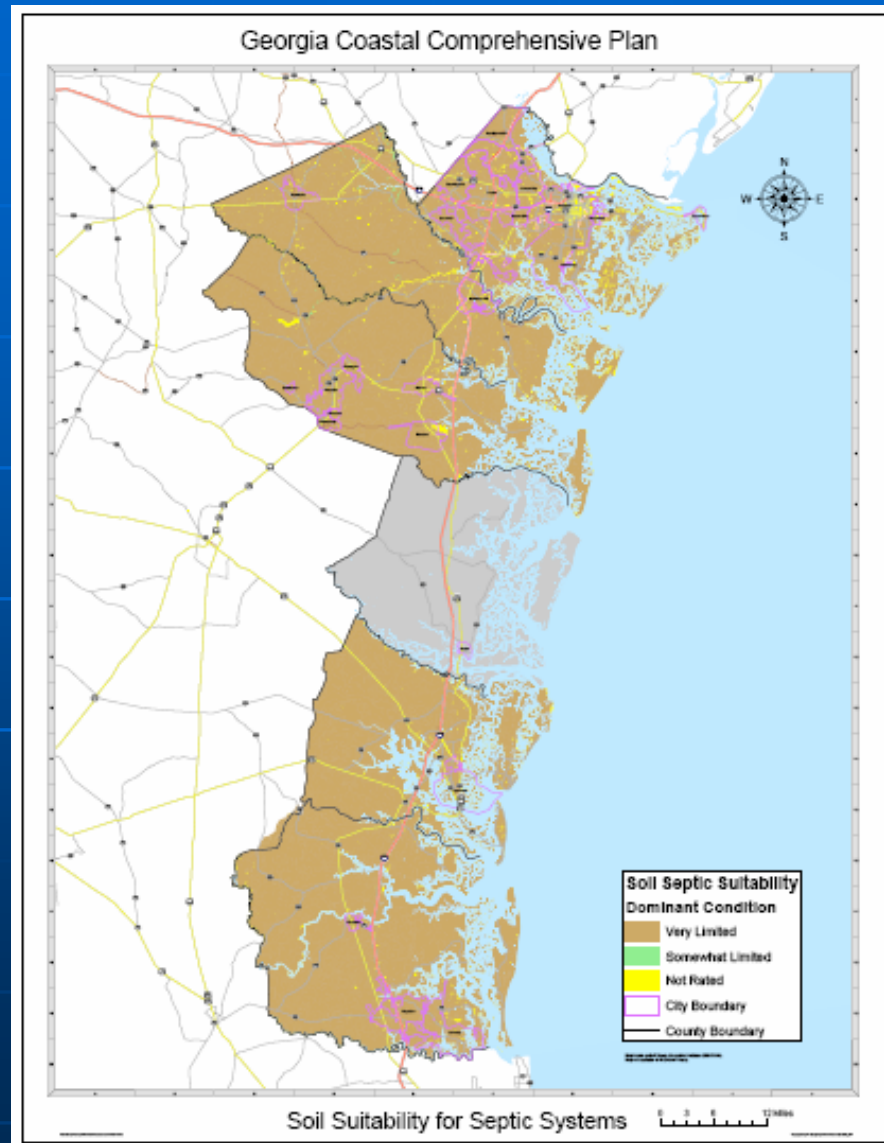

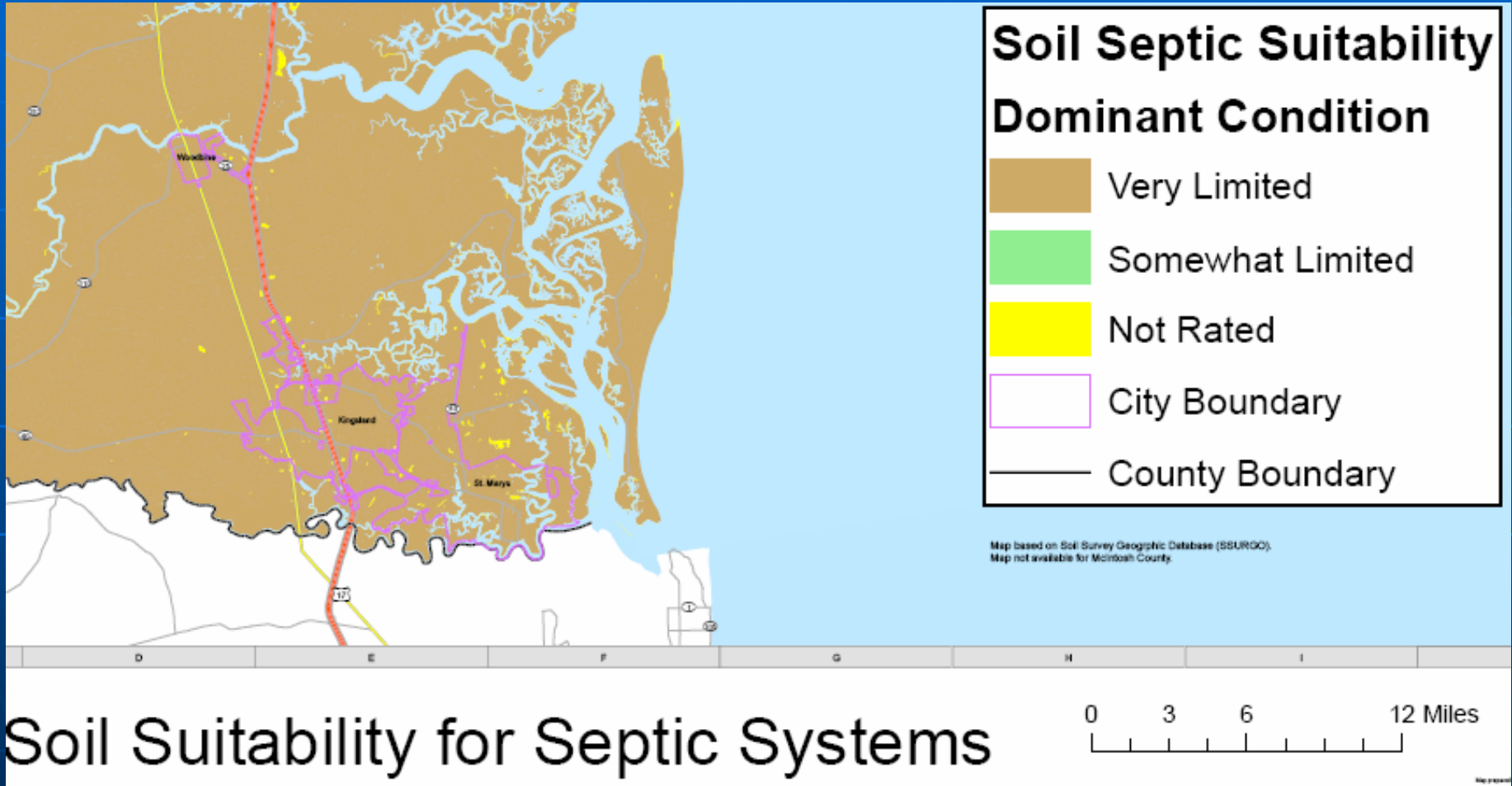


Soil Suitability for Septic Systems

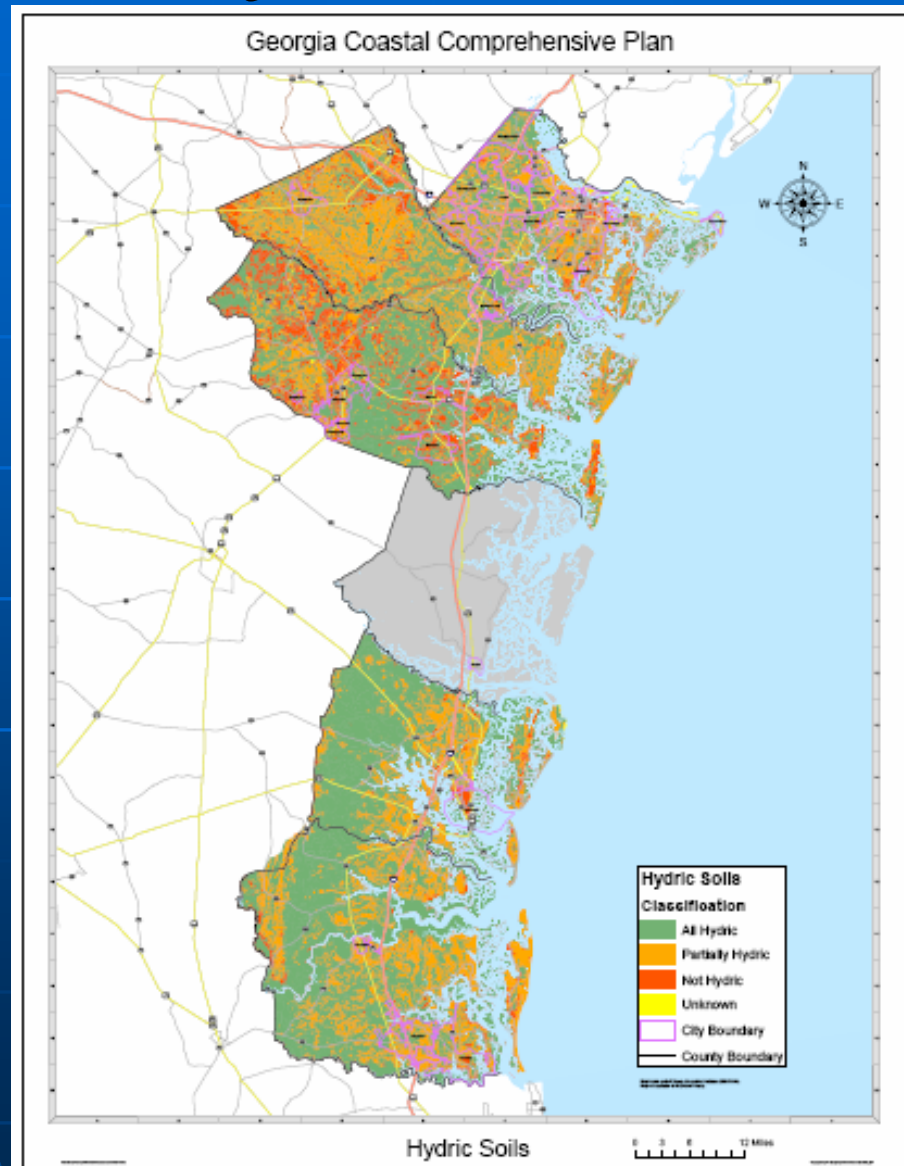

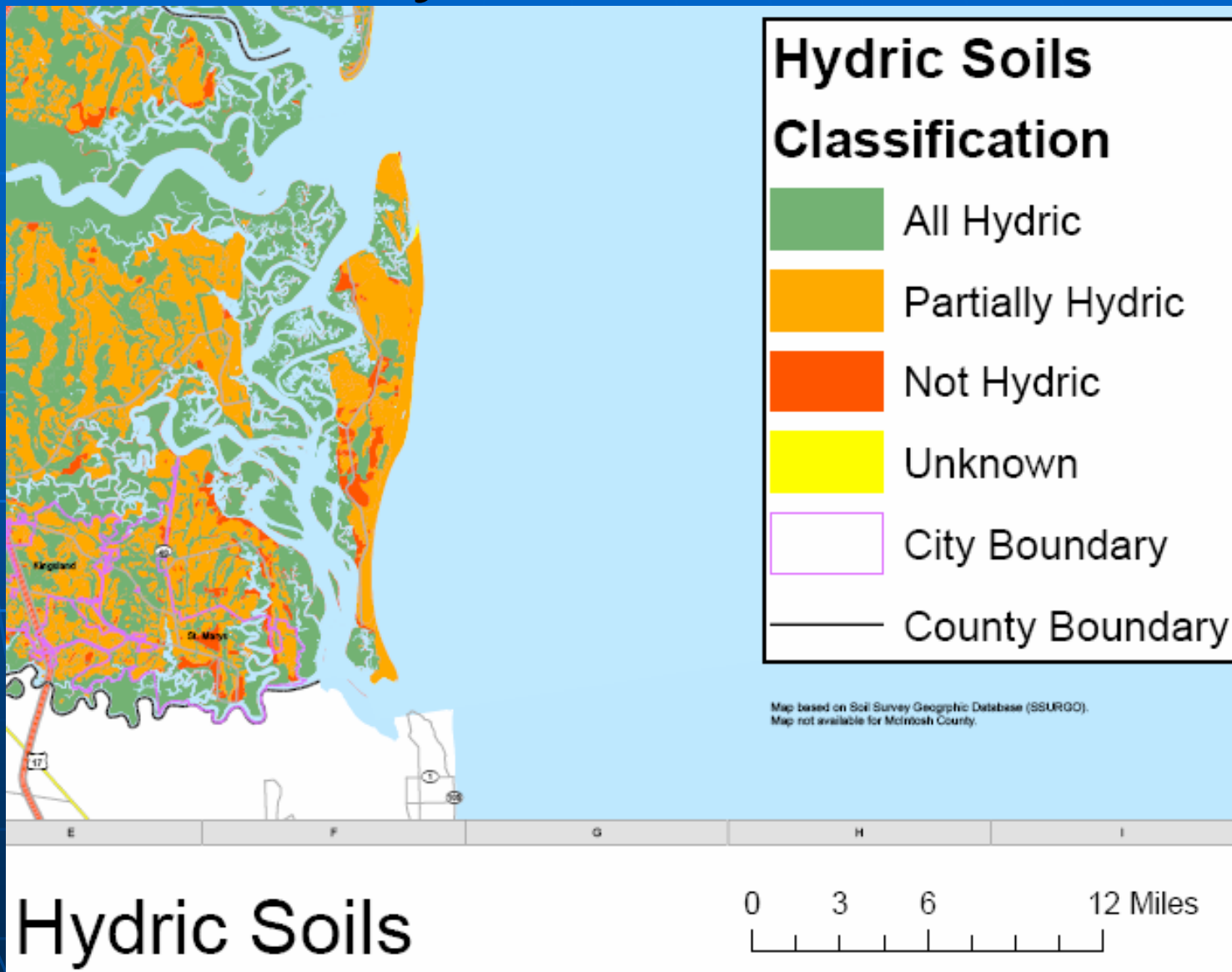


Hydric Soils

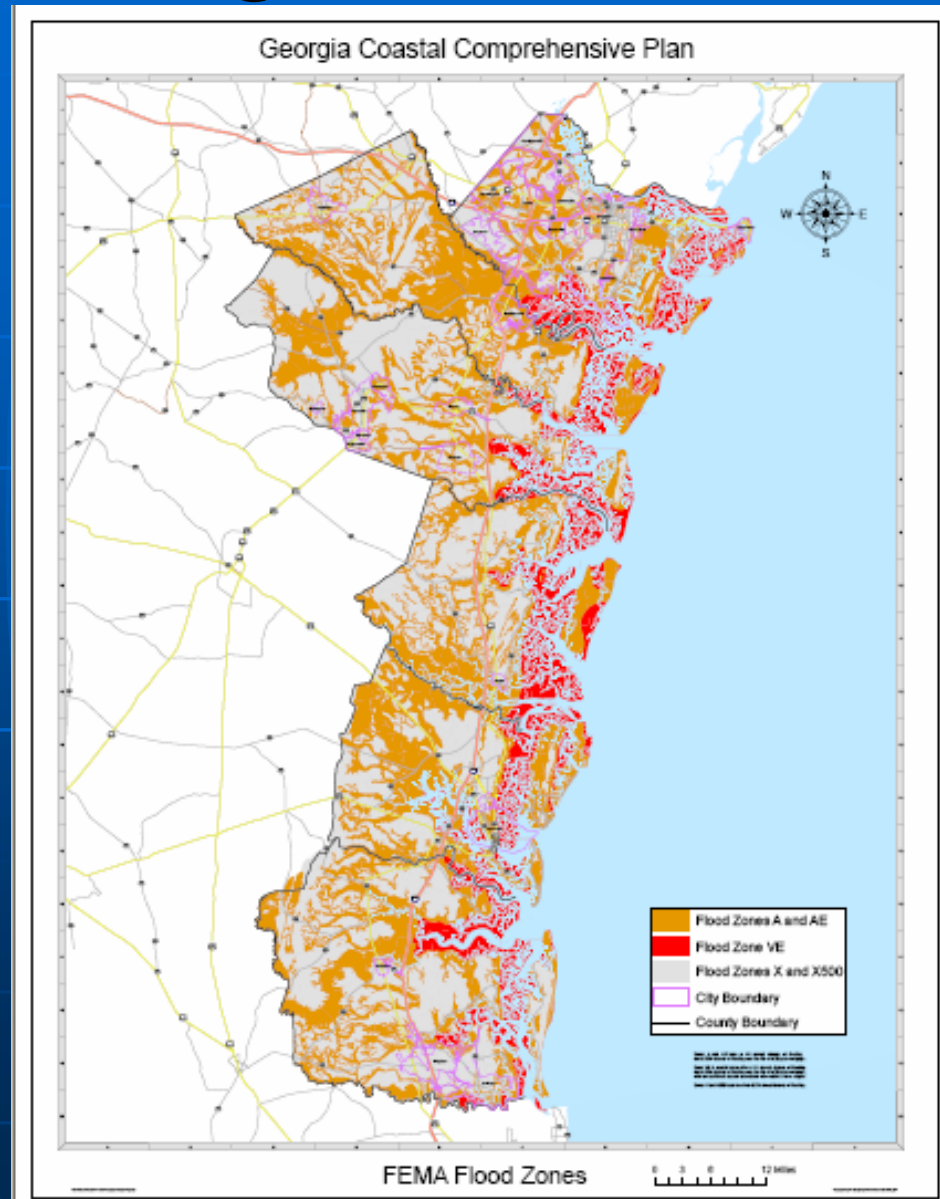

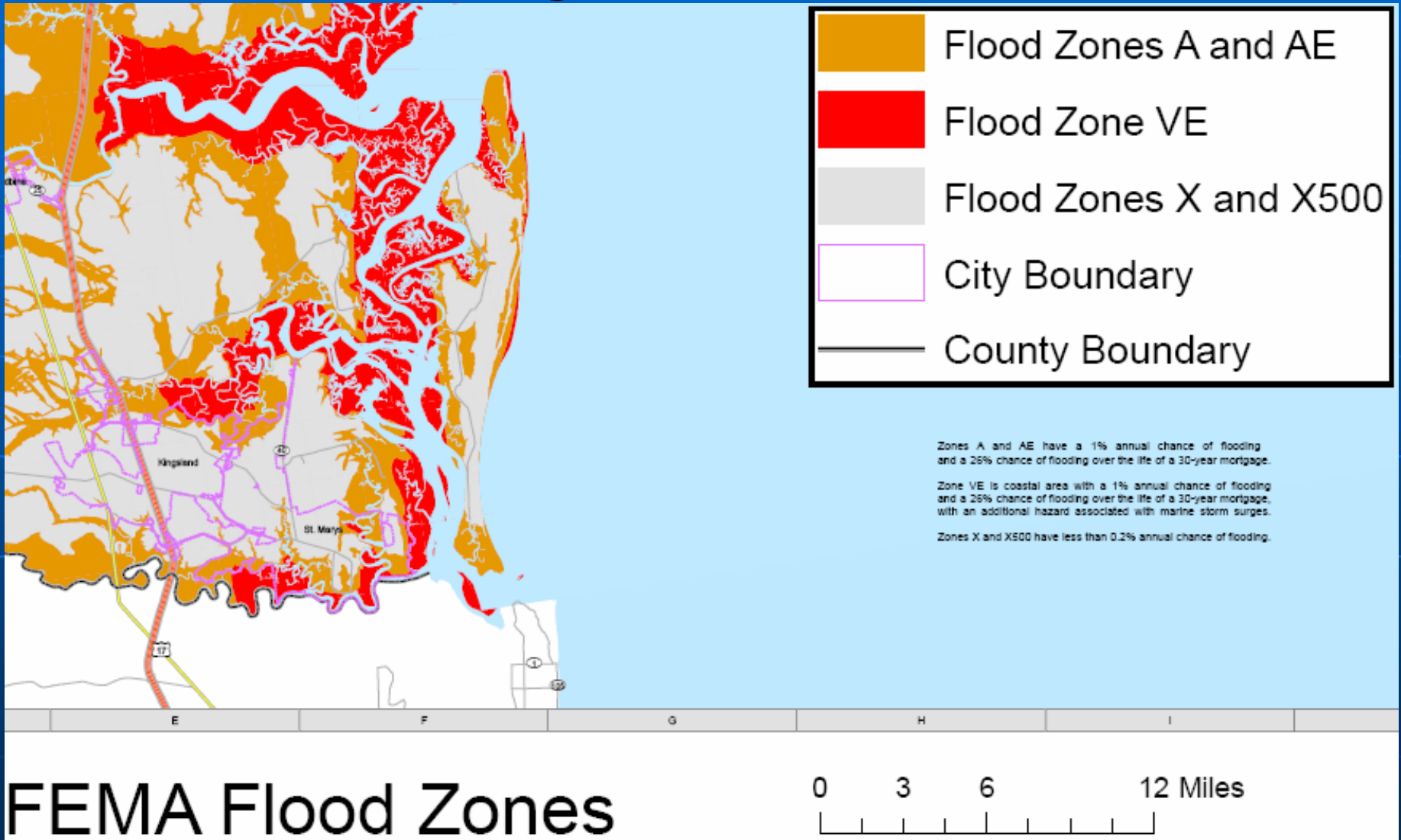

FEMA Designated Flood Zones

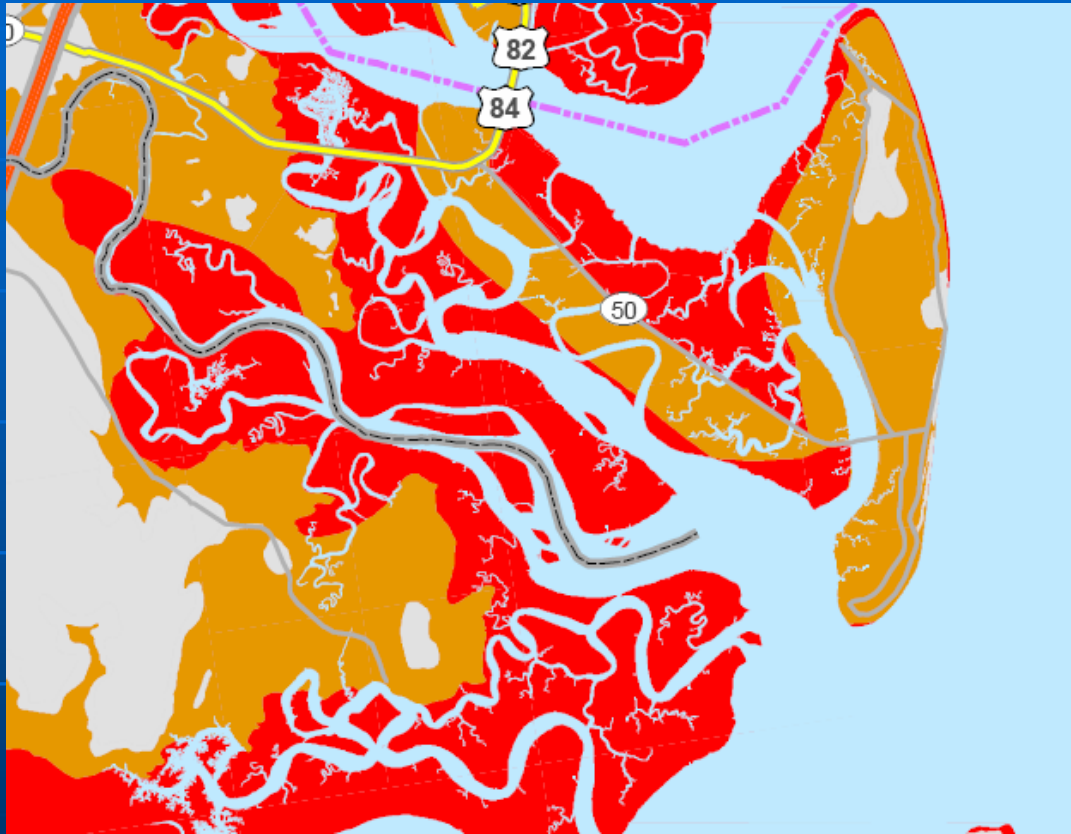


FEMA Designated Flood Zones



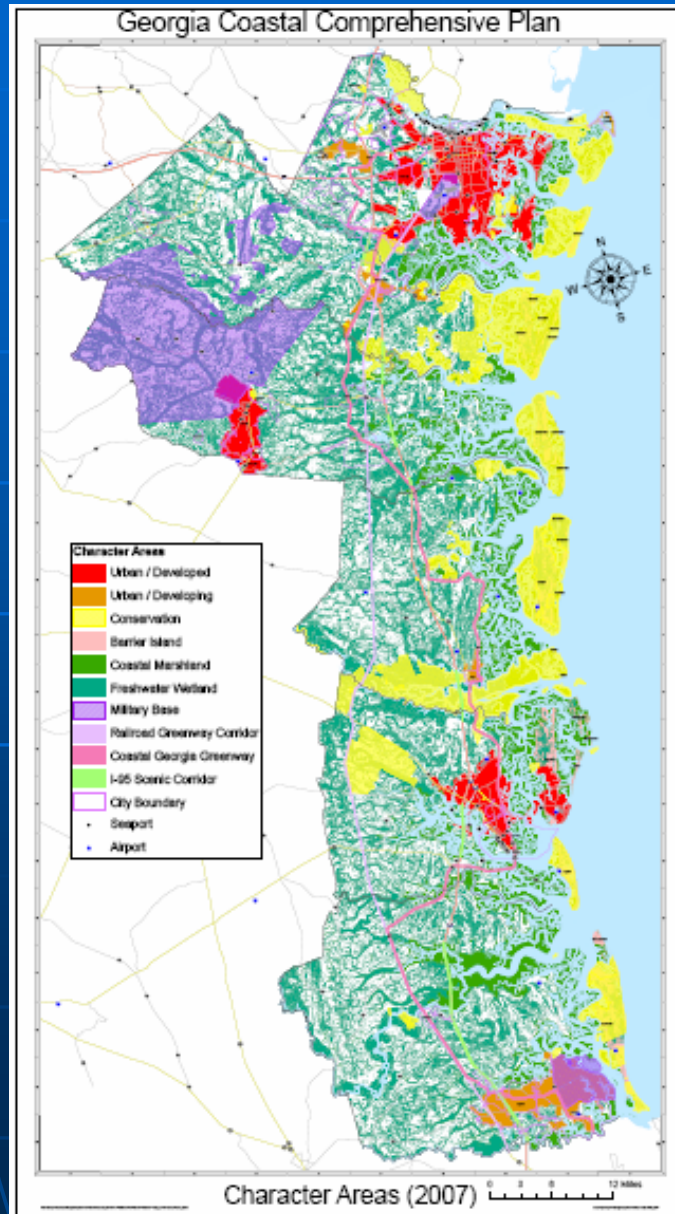
FEMA Flood Zones

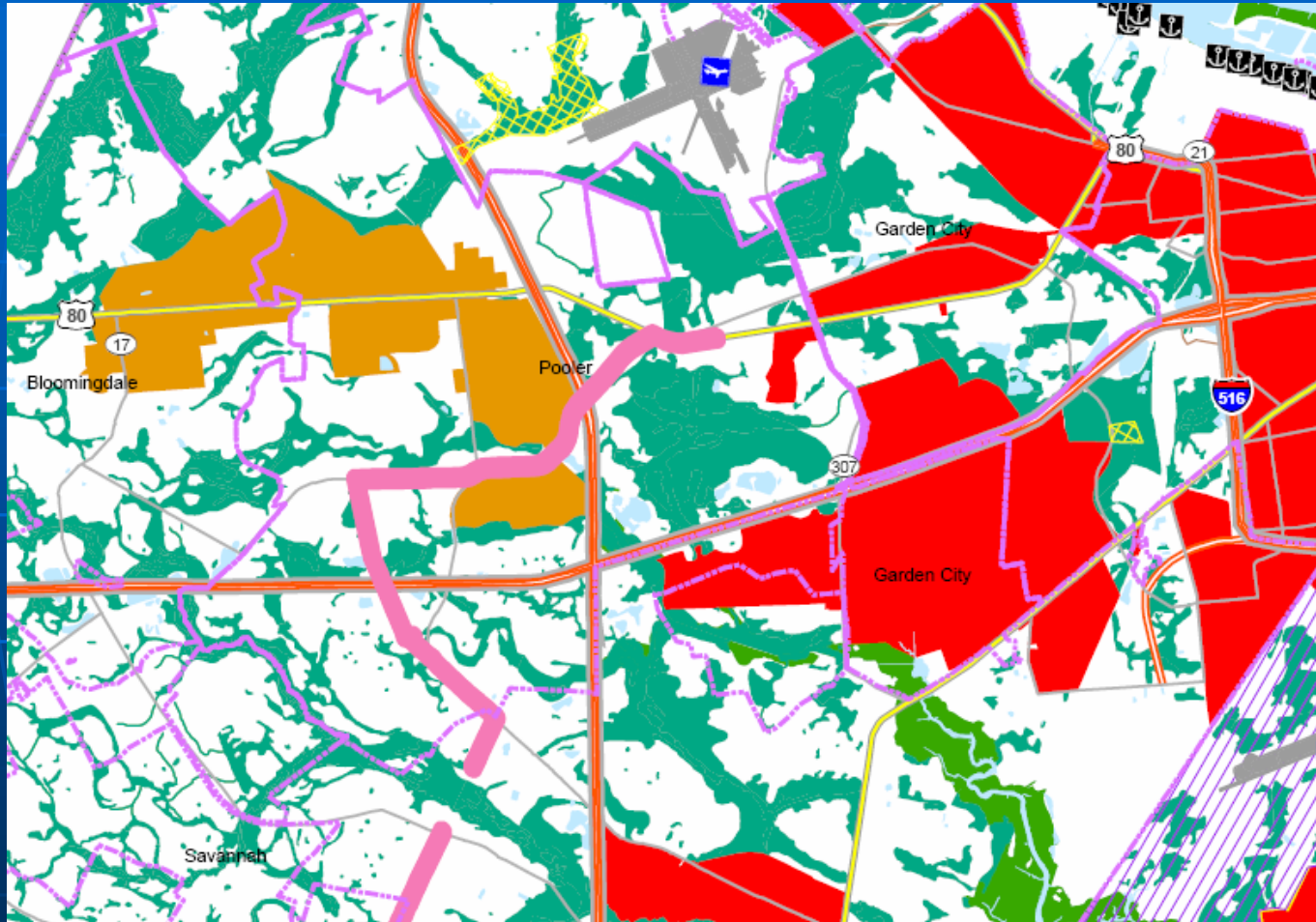

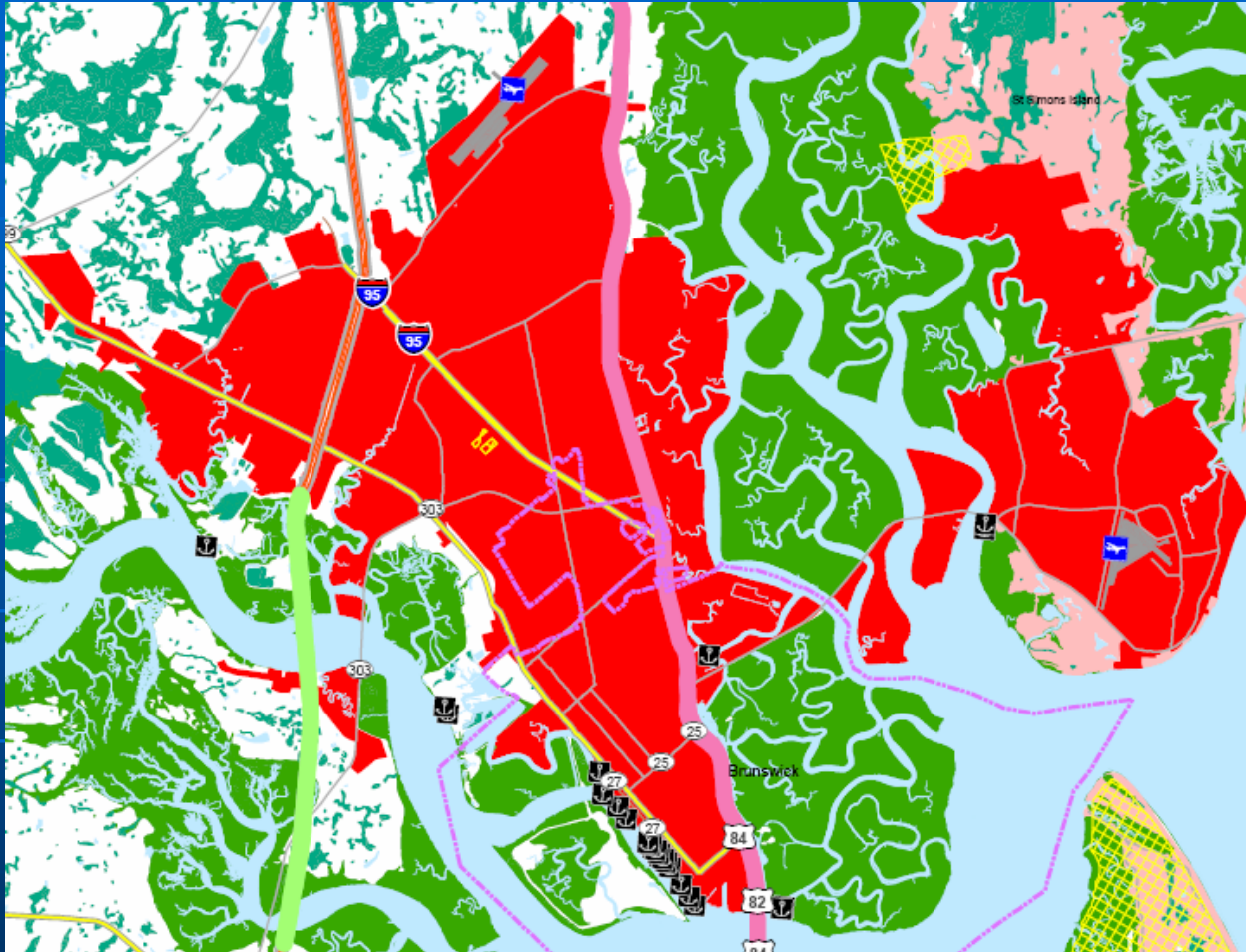
Character Areas

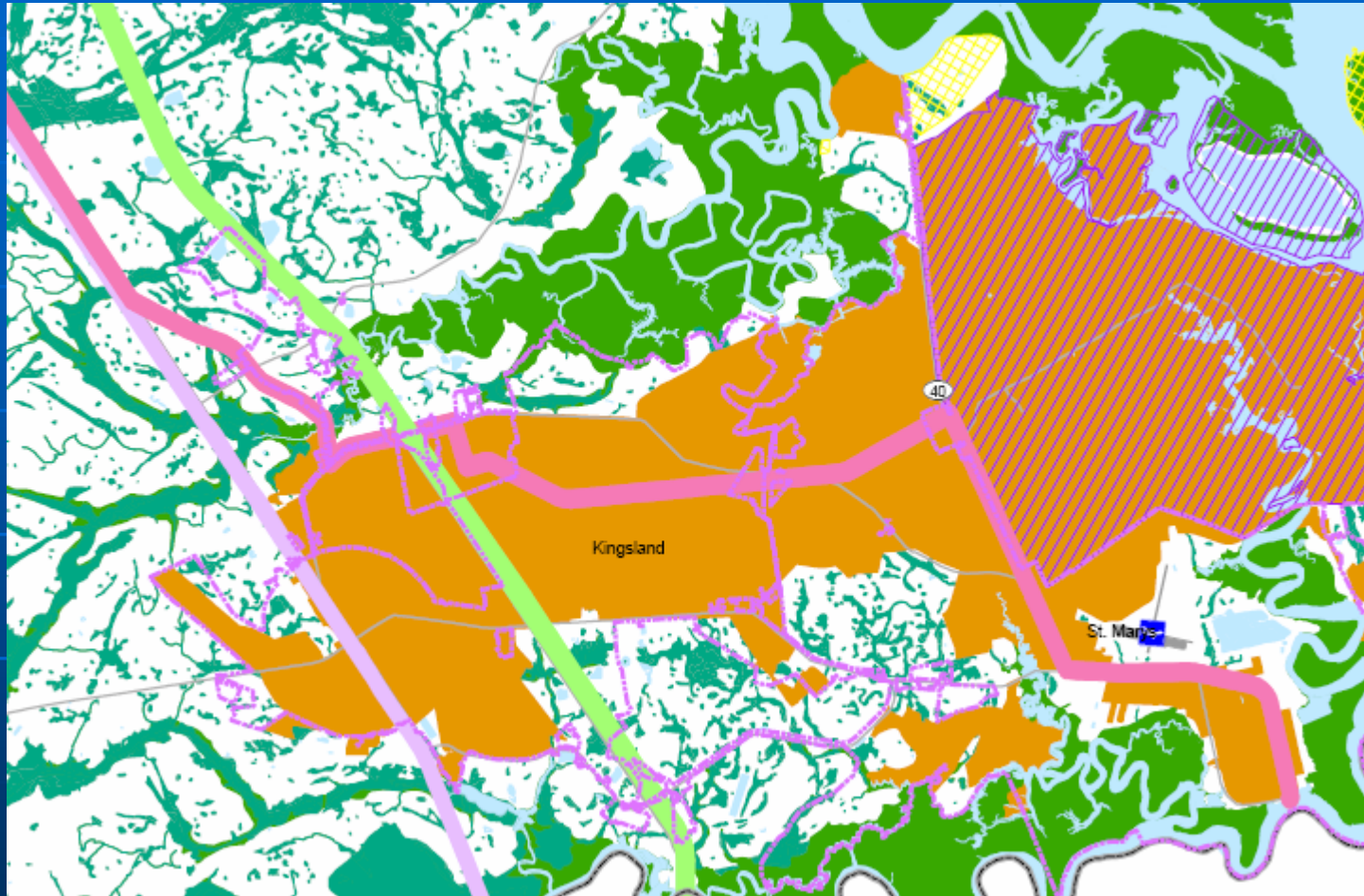


Urban / Developing (Urban Area) = 1,000 persons / square mile

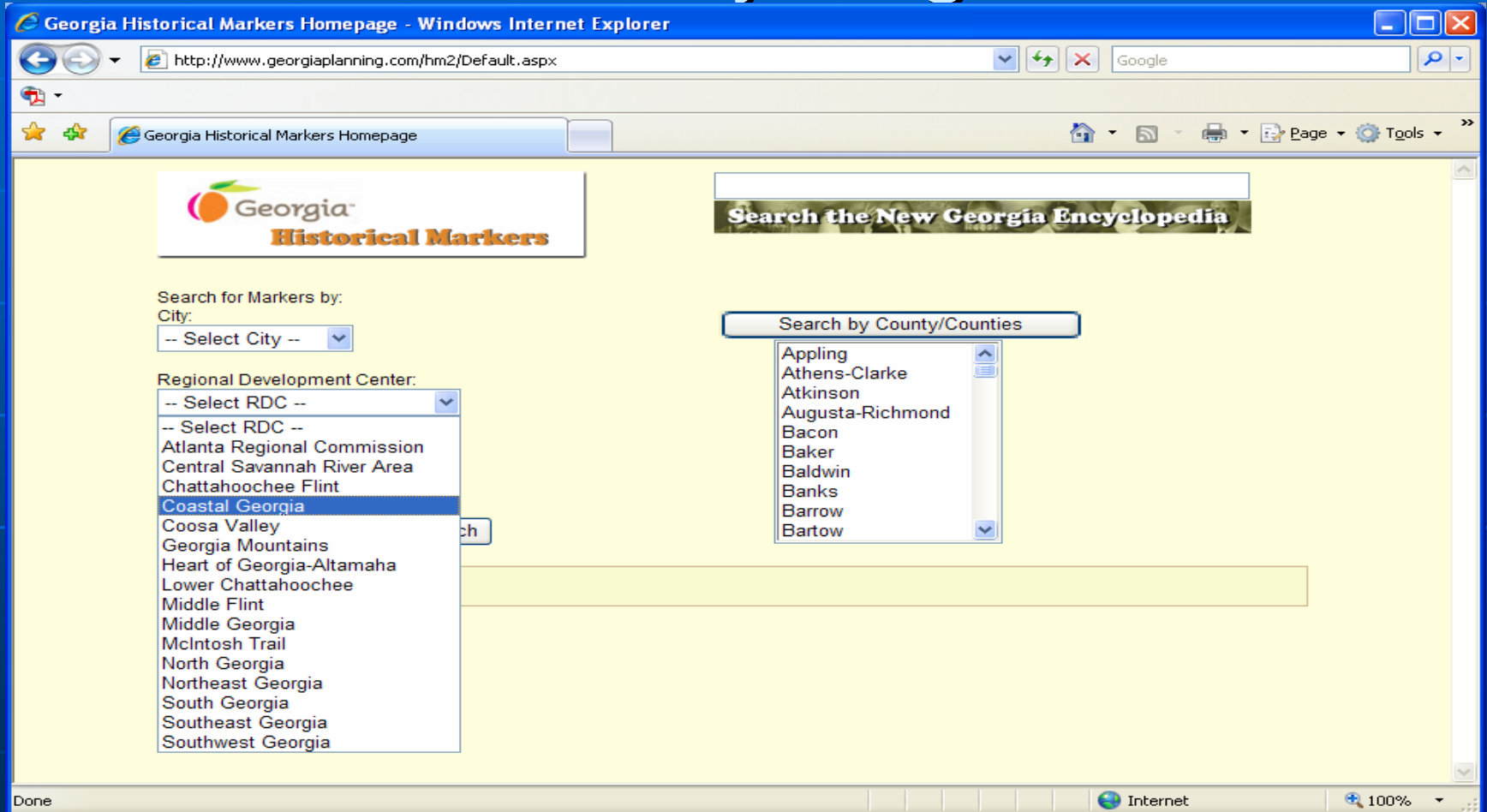

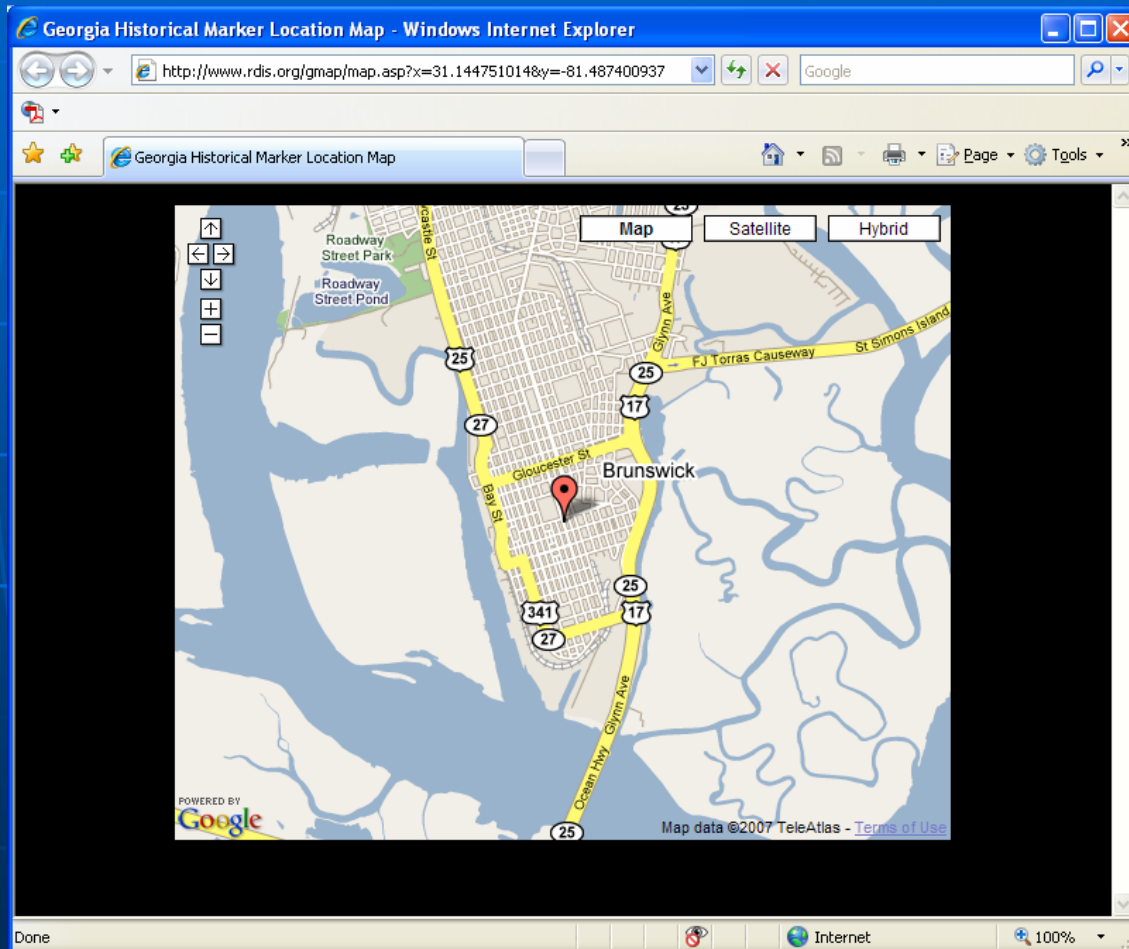

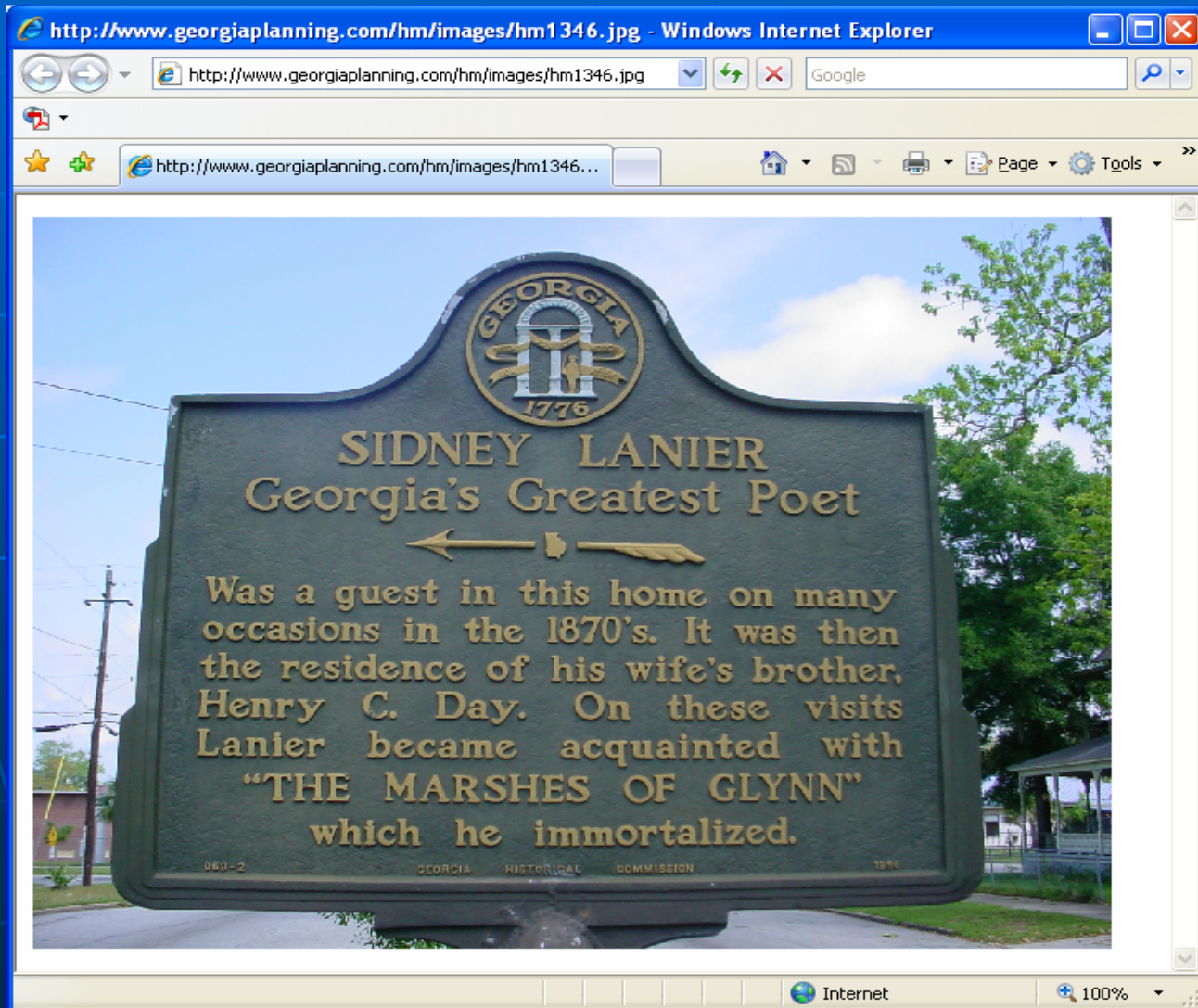
