County: Paulding Service: Sanitary Sewer

Paulding County and the City of Dallas have adopted a sewer district boundary map which delineates the sewer service areas of each jurisdiction (see attached map, Service Delivery Agreement, and Memorandum of Understanding). Paulding County and the City of Hiram have a sewer agreement, addressing issues related to the provision and extension of sanitary sewer.

SERVICE DELIVERY AGREEMENT

Service: Sanitary SewerParties: Paulding County and the cities of Braswell, Dallas and Hiram

Agreement:

Paulding County provides sewer service to a portion of the incorporated limits of both Hiram and Dallas as well as to portions of unincorporated Paulding County. The County and Hiram have an intergovernmental contract relating to the provision and extension of sewer services as they pertain to the two jurisdictions.

Dallas operates a sanitary sewer system that covers portions of its incorporated boundaries as well as portions of unincorporated Paulding County. Under this Agreement, Paulding County and Dallas agree to the service areas shown on the map attached to this agreement. For proposed developments that "straddle" the service boundary lines on the map, the jurisdiction with the greatest percentage of said development shall be the service provider. If it cannot be determined who has the greatest percentage (i.e., close to 50%-50%), the jurisdiction with the nearest system connection shall be the service provider. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent Paulding County and Dallas from mutually agreeing on a variation from these terms. Additional agreements between Dallas and Paulding County concerning sanitary sewer are contained in a Memorandum of Understanding, which is attached hereto and made part of this Service Delivery Agreement on Sanitary Sewer.

We the undersigned agree that the foregoing Service Delivery Agreement promotes the most efficient, effective and responsive manner for the delivery of services described above and we see no apparent duplication of services or issues for consolidation, this 30th day of November 2004.
